Research and Achievements

#### Research

Erianna Basgall works in Dr. Finnigan's lab in the Biochemistry Department developing applications of CRISPR gene editing systems. She has been working in this lab for over two years and has co-first authorship on two publications, one within the last year (Feb. 2019). This publication is called "Modulating CRISPR gene drive activity through nucleocytoplasmic localization of Cas9 in S. cerevisiae".

Hawa Dembele is working with Dr. Prakash on the determination of the three-dimensional structure for the ETH peptide from the African malaria mosquito.

Courtney Johnson is researching with the Culbertson group. Her research involves using analytical methods to research cell pathways by examining cells one at a time. Her research specifically involves optimizing lysis (rupturing of the cell membrane) that occurs in the single cell device that the Culbertson group developed.

Gary 'Mack" McIntosh and Cole Wilson have been working in a lipid research lab under Dr. Durrett for a year and half.
